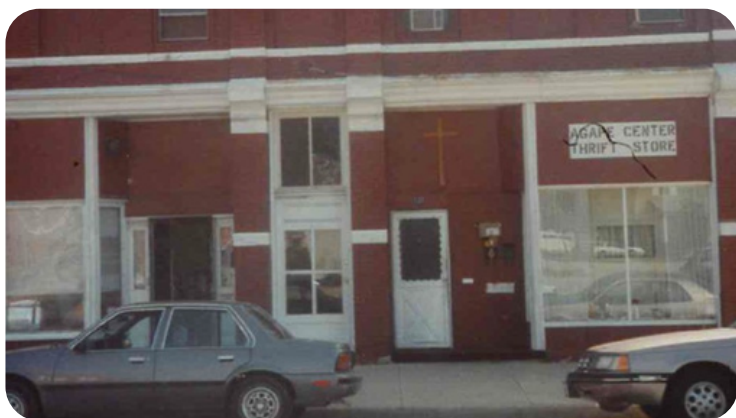


A Look Back In Time

On October 19, 1975 "Agape Pantry" was started with a \$25 donation in the basement of The Presbyterian Church. In 1979 the Maumee Valley Presbytery donated \$1,200 for Agape Pantry to pay 1 year of rent at \$100 a month on a building on South Front Street (pictured left).

In order to support the mission of providing food and clothing to the community, revenue needed to be generated to purchase needed food and items for various programs. Clothing was already being donated. The concept of an Agape Thrift Store began to take shape.

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The Thrift Store has become the primary support of Agape Ministries along with additional funding from grants, foundations, corporations, United Way, individual donors, government grants, churches and many other contributors.

All funding and proceeds are utilized to support Agape Ministries programs. These funds purchase additional perishable and non-perishable food items for the food pantry, Weekend Power Pack Bags and Summer Feeding Program for the area schools, and items for the various programs that Agape Ministries, Inc. provides throughout the year including: Warm Winter Coat Program, Easter Baskets for the kids, Good Friday Food Box Giveaway, Christmas Slumber Fun Program and many other various programs. It also provides for the overhead and operation of the organization.
