

Do You Know Where to Turn During a Disaster?

While we may not be able to control our environment, we can certainly take proactive steps to be prepared for any unforeseen disasters. Ensure the safety and security of both your family and furry friends by kickstarting your emergency preparedness with essential kits. Remember, pets are integral members of the family and must be accounted for in your emergency plan.

When assembling your kit, organize items in airtight plastic bags and place everything in easily transportable containers like plastic bins or a duffel bag. A well-rounded emergency supply kit should include the following essentials: water, non-perishable food, battery-powered radio with NOAA weather radio channel, flashlight, first aid kit, extra batteries, whistle for signaling help, dust mask, tarp and rope or duct tape for sheltering in place, baby wipes and garbage bags for personal sanitation, manual can opener for food, local map, heavy-duty extension cord to plug into a generator and powerbank for cellphone.

Emergency supply kit for your pets should include the following: food (Keep several days' supply of food in an airtight, waterproof container), water (store a water bowl and several days' supply of water), any medicine your pet may be taking) first aid kit, extra leash, copies of your pet's registration information, traveling bag, crate or sturdy carrier (ideally one for each pet), sanitation needs (include pet litter and litter box (if appropriate) and newspapers).

Meet with your family and discuss why you need to prepare for disaster. Explain the dangers of fire, severe weather, and tornados and flooding to children. Plan to share responsibilities and work together as a team. Discuss the types of disasters that are most likely to happen. Explain what to do in each case. Ask an out-of-state friend to be your "family contact." After a disaster, it's often easier to call long distance. Other family members should call this person and tell them where they are. Everyone must know your contact's phone number.

Food Insecurity in Auglaize County

As a result of the latest 2021 report, it is alarming to see that food insecurity is escalating in Auglaize County, painting a stark reality where 1 in 5 children are deprived of adequate nourishment to thrive. This is a pressing issue that demands our attention and concerted efforts to alleviate the plight of vulnerable families in our community.

The recent devastating tornadoes that have ripped through our area have highlighted the critical importance of disaster preparedness.
